It is the student's responsibility to manage all other costs associated with attending Prairie Christian Academy (e.g., school books and supplies, special course materials, sports and club fees, school activity fees, etc.).

Golden Hills School Division offers a discount to:

- Returning students
- Students with a Canadian passport
- Families with more than one child in our program

Additional fees:

- Additional days of Dormitory accommodation: \$45/day.
- Dormitory Damage Deposit (refundable): \$250. Some or all will be withheld if the room is not left clean.
- Medical insurance is mandatory in Canada and will be purchased for the student by Golden Hills.
- Grade 12 Diploma examination fees are set by the Alberta Government and are payable by the student.
- Validation fee: \$125.00 (if required).

The Student Services fee includes:

- One airport pick-up and drop-off at Calgary International Airport (additional airport transportation is available at a charge).
- Residence placement.
- Homestay and dormitory monitoring by our in-house accommodations coordinators.
- Orientation.
- English assessment.
- Custodianship.
- Group activities.

Information

Due Dates

The registration fee (\$250 CAD) is nonrefundable and is due with the submission of the application.

All fees become payable in Canadian Dollars once the Letter of Acceptance is issued. All fees are due prior to the student's arrival in Canada (exact due dates for fees are listed on the invoice).

Medical Expenses

In the event of a medical incident, all expenses not covered by the student's medical insurance are the responsibility of the student/parent and shall be paid directly to the authority from whom the cost originated (for example, Alberta Health Services). We encourage students and parents to consider supplemental medical insurance from their home country.

Refund Policy

Entry denied by the Canadian Government

If the student's study permit and/or entry visa is denied by the Canadian Government, all paid fees (except the registration fee) will be refunded once our office receives proof of the denied permit/visa.

Prorated refunds

There will be no refund of tuition fees once any of the following have occurred:

- the student receives a Canadian study permit and/or entry visa, or
- the student arrives in Canada.

If a student leaves after having commenced studies, Golden Hills International will attempt to refund a portion of the fees already paid, including homestay or dormitory fees, medical insurance fees, and student services fees. If a student submitted a medical insurance claim while in Canada, medical insurance fees cannot be refunded.

Removal from the program

If a student is removed from Golden Hills School Division, no refund will be issued and any costs incurred to return the student to his/her home country will be the responsibility of the agent/parent.

- A student who engages in any activity prohibited by Canadian, Albertan, or municipal law, and/or the Alberta *School Act*, may be removed from the program with no refund issued and no right to appeal.
- If a student, parent, or agent has omitted or falsified information or otherwise misrepresented the truth on an application (including transcripts and all other supporting documents) or in correspondence thereafter, the student's application may be denied or the student may be removed from the program with no refund issued.
- Golden Hills School Division reserves the right to return a student to his/her home country—at the expense of the agent/parent—if payment is not received in full within a month of commencing studies in Canada.
